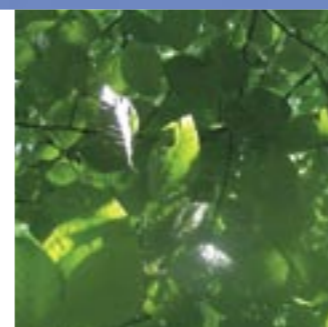

Eco environmental works closely with the ISPCC in order to co- ordinate our national textile bank-recycling scheme.

For over 100 years the ISPCC has been Ireland's leading independent children's charity advocating for the rights, well being and protection of children.

The ISPCC's vision is to see an Ireland where all children are heard and valued.

The ISPCC's mission is to advocate on behalf of all children in Ireland and to provide a range of independent unique services which are preventative and empowering in nature.

On an average year, the ISPCC engages directly with over 1/3 of Ireland's one million children – 2,000 a day via the Childline service alone. As economic pressure puts greater strains on families and communities, an even greater need for their services is anticipated. By working in partnership with the ISPCC, Eco Environmental will be making a real difference to the lives of some of the most vulnerable children in Ireland by raising much needed funds for the expansion of the ISPCC's mentoring services.



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## THE PROCESS

### Collection Service

Our team of drivers make daily collections from both charity shops and Textile banks nationwide.

### Process

All our textiles are taken to a purpose built factory where they are manually sorted in to specific materials, colours and quality. The clothes are then graded and baled and distributed to a wide range of national and overseas markets.

### Environment

Caring for a healthier environment is everyone's responsibility, and Eco Environment are here to support you in doing that. All our processes are dry non-toxic operations, which have no negative environmental implications. We in fact contribute positively to the environment in that we dispose safely of large amounts of material, which would otherwise add to the already excessive burden currently being experienced in landfills nationwide.

## FACTS

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66% of clothes collected are exported to African countries for re use.

24% of clothes collected are shredded down in to raw material (known as flock), which are used for a wide range of purposes such as carpets, mattresses, sofas and soundproofing.

6% of clothes collected are sent to Pakistan for reuse

2% consists of plastic bags of which the clothes arrive in. These are then sent to a local processor for recycling.

2% goes to landfill. These consist of odd shoes, broken toys damp and dirty clothes.

### DID YOU KNOW?

Textile recycling is one of the longest running forms of recycling, "rag and bone man".

About 3% of household landfill waste consists of textiles.

Last year between 30000 and 35000 tonnes of textiles went to land fill therefore there is a definite requirement for textile banks from an environmental perspective.
